






Drom was founded by Breton singer Erik Marchand, known for his work with musicians from Romania, Turkey, Moldavia, Bulgaria... Drom means « the road » in Romanian, road that leads artists through the world of popular cultures : The Bretagne-based association is strongly dedicated to enriching the journey and career of young musicians through the encounter and learning of other popular traditional musics by offering professional trainings.

Drom is mostly known for « Kreiz Breizh Akademi » a year-long training for professional musicans, assuming a modal approach of Breton music. Every two years, a dozen young musicians in the process of professionalization take part to this orchestra. The 9th orchestra is currently giving concerts (see picture), while the 10th is now in training.


